Beaumond House is a registered charity that has been committed to providing supportive palliative care to patients and their families living in Newark and district since 1987. We have four in-patient beds for people with palliative care needs, Day Therapy and Wellbeing service, as well as Hospice at Home providing compassionate support in the community.

Providing care and support to patients and their families costs Beaumond House around £1.6million every year. This means that around £1million of this needs to be raised through donations, our shops, and local businesses throughout Newark and Sherwood.

This year, Beaumond House will receive £531,000 towards the cost of delivering our in-patient, day therapy and wellbeing service and hospice at home commissioned through the End of Life Together Alliance (funded from the Integrated Care System), which contributes to our overall operating costs.

Each year we provide care for over 550 patients and support to their families, caring for around 100 patients at any one time. All of our direct care services are provided free.

We are registered with the Care Quality Commission. We offer care and support for people with any diagnosis who have a palliative care need whether this is a cancer, long term condition, neurological disease, frailty or are naturally coming to the end of their life through old age

Coddington Community Centre

Hello Everyone,

I would like to start by thanking the trustees of the Community Centre for their work in keeping things running and in order.

As we head into the cold winter months I would like to urge people to take care when walking through the car park, particularly when it is cold, you never know when you may slip on something. This also goes for during the school pick up time in the afternoon.

We are continuously battling with people who think it is OK to park on the double yellow lines. This not only blocks the exit for vehicles who have parked in the bays provided it reduces visibility around the car park increasing the risk of an incident. The Parish Council provided cones to highlight that there should be NO PARKING on the double yellow lines but people now park beside them creating an even bigger problem.

We have reviewed the issue of the car park flooding, the quotations to alter the car park are quite costly and reveal that it is not a cost effective project as the water has normally drained away within 24 hours. Be aware that if it has rained for any considerable length of time there is a good chance of standing water the next day.

We are moving forward with replacing the gate at the entrance to the car park to include a high level barrier to stop unwanted large vehicles accessing the car park without prior permission.

We will be moving forward with changes to the area around the School Entrance, essentially the plan will be to remove the grass and pave the area to improve the access. We will also improve the access from the disabled bays to the school entrance.

On a different note we were drawn out as a winner on the Newark and Sherwood Community Lottery winning £500 which we plan to use to rework the flower beds in front of the building to improve the look of the area.


