Parish Council Report August 2026

Welcome to the summer edition of Coddington Village News.

We're having a few upgrades within the village with new white and yellow road markings, the upgrade of Newark Road path and hopefully the resurfacing of Balderton Lane in this financial year. All of these improvements have been a result of continuing pressure from the Parish Council on the County Council to improve our village.

We have had to take the village sign down again as it was showing signs of deterioration far sooner than we had hoped. We're now getting quotes for either a plastic or metal village sign which will last many more years. The artwork for this will replicate the current village sign.

The village fete was a great success again with around 400 people of all ages visiting the event. The star of the show was the Dakota flypast and we have already applied for a similar flypast for next year's event on 3rd July. We are hopeful by then the Lancaster will be flying again, so fingers crossed !

The BBQ raised just over £900 which has been split between the school £450, the scouts £150 with the balance split between Chalk to Fork a Newark Agricultural Society charity and Notts/Lincs air ambulance. These were two charities nominated by the Allen family in thanks for their continued support in supplying all the bales for the school sports day and fete as well as supplying all of the sausages for the BBQ.

Thanks to everyone who attended, all the volunteers, stall holders, groups that performed and the community centre for the use of their facilities as well as the school for hosting the event again. It was a superb village event showcasing Coddington's community spirit. Thanks also to Coddington Trust, the Parish Council and to Tritax for their generous financial support without which we would not be able to offer the free bouncy castles, face painter and live music.

Any ideas for next year's event please let me know.

From the Vicar – Revd Louise,

As I sit to write this letter, Spain is celebrating victory over Argentina in the World Cup. Like many, I have followed the progress of England through the stages and felt the disappointment of the semi-final defeat. It must be said that I did not stay up to watch all the matches live, although I soon became aware of the results, as I heard the celebratory singing on Main Street!

I'm not an avid football fan – rugby is my game of choice – but even I found myself caught up in the atmosphere of hope and excitement.

Great sporting events have the capacity to bring communities together. Arthur Fery's amazing efforts at Wimbledon are another example of hope and joy bringing about a connection as viewers tuned in and crowds gathered on Henman Hill. The very fact that we have Henman Hill, or Murray Mound if you prefer, at Wimbledon speaks into the truth that we are bound together by a common focus. Differences are put aside as a shared purpose brings a sense of pride and belonging. Such occasions remind us that we are part of something bigger and we have a place.

I return from my break with a renewed love and respect for the communities that make up our benefice and a real appreciation for all that we do together.

I also understand that you all had a very successful and enjoyable time at this year's Coddington Community Fair, yet another wonderful example of a community coming together and supporting each other.

Talking of which let me just remind you of what's happening at Coddington church over the coming weeks. In addition to our regular 10.00am monthly

services on September 27th, October 25th and November 22nd – to which you are all most welcome – we have two other important services – ‘**Harvest Festival**’ on Sunday 4th October at 3.00pm at which we will celebrate the wonder of God’s creation and the hard work of our local farmers in providing food for us all – and then on Sunday 8th November at 10.30am our ‘**Remembrance Sunday Service**’. This is an opportunity for us all to come together as a community including representatives from the Parish Council and uniformed organisations such as the Coddington scout group to honour by name all those local people who gave their lives for the freedom we enjoy today. Also, on Sunday 1st November at 6.00pm we shall be holding a benefice wide (Balderton, Barnby & Coddington) Commemoration service at St Giles Balderton for those families who have lost loved ones - all are welcome to attend.

Village Hall News



The Village Hall has been a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO) for some years now; this means that as well as being a registered charity it is able to hold property (which it does, being the freehold owner of the hall) and has the benefits of a limited company. This means that (as long as there is no dereliction of duty) the Trustees do not have any financial liability. With that in mind, we would like to invite anyone who might be interested in joining the small team who care for our hall to get in touch (no initial commitment) with a view to helping secure its future.

The major project to improve the thermal efficiency of the original 1885 corrugated iron building is being progressed in the form of grant hunting! The lead time for grants means that there's no good news as yet. Unfortunately Historic England consider that we are not in a deprived area so are not eligible for their Heritage at Risk Capital Fund, which seems to me to be a strangely irrelevant way for such a body to consider whether a building deserves funding or not. I admit bias!

The Volunteer Maintenance Team meet for half a day each month to deal with a myriad of minor maintenance issues – from adjusting door catches through gardening, painting, sweeping the paths and generally ensuring the hall looks at its best. It's a sociable occasion with the inevitable tea/coffee/biscuit break! More hands make light work so please get in touch if you might like to join us, no particular skills needed but woodworking or electrical experience or knowledge would be particularly helpful.

Our Live Events are an essential part of our fundraising and have been well supported, bringing in a considerable number of visitors from neighbouring areas. We have three events scheduled so far – see separate article and also the website or notice boards in due course for further information.

Coddington History Group Trip to Belper

In February Dr. Ian Jackson gave the group a talk on the history of the use of water power on the River Derwent, which led to the idea of a summer outing to learn more about it.

On 1 July, thankfully between heat-waves, no fewer than 24 of us set out for Belper, mostly on the direct train from Newark Castle.

We split into two groups of twelve for a 90-minute guided tour of Strutt's North Mill, one of the Derwent Valley Mills given UNESCO World Heritage status in 2001. The tour took us into the bowels of the mill as well as around the outside and up one of the nearby streets of mill workers' cottages.

We were particularly fortunate that due to repair works taking place on one of the weirs, the channels through the mill had been drained giving a better view of the sluices than would normally be seen.

Afterwards the group enjoyed lunch in the nearby Devonshire Arms.

Thursday 17th September 2026. Emily Gillot – Recent Archaeology in Nottinghamshire. A welcome return visit for Emily, Planning Archaeologist with Nottinghamshire County Council, she will present stories of recent discoveries on subjects ranging from cremation and burials to Roman villas and pottery, ritual landscapes in Skegby, charcoal burning in Sherwood Forest, and more!

Thursday 15th October 2026. Megan King – Treasures in Nottinghamshire. Meghan is the Finds Liaison Officer for Derbyshire and Nottinghamshire, she offers a fascinating insight into the recording of small finds of archaeological interest over 300 years old which have been found by members of the public. This talk will introduce the Portable Antiquities Scheme and the Treasure process and provide an overview of interesting finds from the counties.

Thursday 15th November 2026. John Cotterill – Nottinghamshire in the second world war. Explores both the adventures and sacrifice of some of Nottinghamshire's men and women on battlefields worldwide and the experience of those who fought on the Home Front. John Cotterill MBE spent 37 years as a regular Army officer , serving all over the world. He is now involved in assembling and researching the county's Second World War Roll of Honour.

January 21st 2027. Adrian Gray – The Top Ten Scandals of Sherwood Forest. Exploring the debauchery, financial ruin, and marital disasters of the aristocracy who lived in "The Dukeries" between the 1600s and 1900s.

Protecting Our Green Spaces and Keeping the Community Centre Accessible

A long-term commitment to our open spaces

When I was first elected, our local green spaces were not being properly cared for and were regularly affected by illegal encampments and other misuse. I made it a priority to protect and improve these areas so they could be enjoyed by the whole community.

Over the years, we have secured around £250,000 of investment for the green spaces at Thorpe Oak and Thorpe Close. This has funded new play equipment, protective bunds, railings and fencing, as well as new trees, bird boxes and bat boxes.

The photographs show just how much these areas have changed. They are now well-used and cherished community spaces, supporting recreation, wildlife and local biodiversity. The physical improvements and protections also make future development much more difficult. Thorpe Close had previously been identified as a possible location for flats, but the work carried out has considerably strengthened the case for preserving it as an open space.

There is always more to do, but I am proud of the progress we have made. I



will continue working with residents, the Parish Council and our local authorities to protect these valuable spaces for future generations.

Safe and considerate parking at the Community Centre

Last week, I joined the Community Centre, the Chairman of the Parish Council and District Council enforcement officers for a parking action day. The aim was not simply to issue fines, but to encourage safe and considerate parking particularly during busy school drop-off and collection times.

The Community Centre car park is an important local facility and must remain accessible to visitors and people attending activities. Vehicles should therefore be parked entirely within the marked spaces. When no spaces are

available, parents, carers and other drivers must find a safe and legal alternative elsewhere.

Parking on yellow lines, hatched areas or outside the designated bays can restrict access, create hazards for pedestrians and other road users, and put the future use of the car park at risk. Enforcement officers will continue to visit regularly, and vehicles parked in restricted areas may receive a penalty charge notice.

Nobody wants to see residents being fined. What we all want is a safe, accessible and welcoming Community Centre. Please help us achieve that by parking responsibly and showing consideration for others.

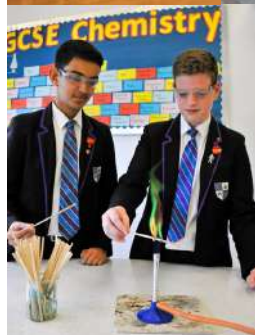

AUTUMN LEAVES

Yes, they can be a problem, but we ask you not to sweep or blow the leaves from your property or from the grass verges, onto footpaths and roads. In some areas in the village, where leaves have been swept from properties, there have been issues such as drains becoming badly blocked, which then causes flooding onto footpaths and roads, resulting in dangerous slippery surfaces.

Please collect the leaves, put them into black bags or into your garden bin, or better still they are very beneficial as mulch in your garden. Worms will gradually take them down into the soil where the rotting leaves will much improve the texture of the soil. Heaps can be left in corners of your garden for hedgehogs, other small creatures and insects to overwinter and to give Mother Nature a helping hand.

Hello Everyone,

In July I met with Councillor John Lee and Parish Council Chairman Mike Ayres at the car park during one of the afternoon school pick up times. A parking enforcement officer was also present. It was good to hear the feedback from parents at the time however one person thought it was necessary to verbally abuse the parking officer and the usual keyboard warriors on social media came out in force after the event. All we are trying to maintain is a safe environment for the children to be collected from school.

Again we have had people thinking that they are entitled to use the toilets in the centre. Most of our users are classed as vulnerable, which means that we have to follow the Safeguarding guidelines in the Care Act 2014 which requires us to provide a secure place for them to meet with appropriate facilities to which the public do not have access.

The number of regular users is still increasing which is good for us but we need to consider the increase in expenditure that goes with it as more people means more consumables are needed.

The legal frameworks that we need to have in place are much more demanding in today's climate than 20 years ago when the Community Centre was first opened. Keeping our documentation and certification in order is an ongoing challenge which is also time consuming.

We would welcome assistance from anyone who feels comfortable navigating the documentation that we need to have in place to efficiently run a facility like ours.

Pilates works the body as a whole and aims to co-ordinate the upper and lower muscle groups with the centre of the body, increasing strength and flexibility.

I am also a Yoga teacher so will incorporate movements and ideas that complement the work.

Thee classes are suitable for all levels, including rehabilitation. It is about learning to move freely and without discomfort.
